3. Composition / Information	on on Ingredients
Warnings:	For <i>in vitro</i> diagnostic use only. Do not pipette by mouth. Handle laboratory reagents in accordance with Good Laboratory Practice.
	May cause irritation to skin and eyes, may be irritating to mucous membranes and upper respiratory tract. Avoid contact with skin, avoid inhalation and ingestion.
	The standard in this kit contains human serum albumin. This has been tested for the HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) Antibody, HBs Ag and HCV and found to be non-reactive. However as no method can offer complete assurance as to the absence of infectious agents, this material and all patient samples should be handled as though capable of transmitting infectious disease and disposed of accordingly.
	The standard contains Sodium Azide (<0.1%w/v). Sodium azide reacts with lead or copper plumbing to form potentially explosive azides. When disposing of such reagents flush with large volumes of water to prevent azide build up. Exposed metal surfaces should be cleaned with 10% sodium hydroxide.
